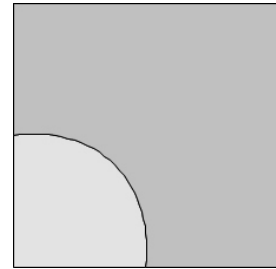


NPQG Mystery Quilt - Part 3

In this part you will be making 56 blocks. These blocks have a curved pieced design, but you have several options how you can make them: They can be curved-pieced on your sewing machine if you are comfortable doing curved piecing. You can also applique them by hand or machine with a turned-edge, or fused raw-edge secured with hand or machine stitching.



Make 56

There are separate instructions for three different methods to make this block. Choose one method, follow those instructions and ignore the other two. Please read through all of the instructions in your method before cutting your fabrics..



Machine Pieced:

The templates are marked with cutting details. You will need to cut 56 from the Background fabric using the large template, and 56 of Fabric B using the small template. Sew one small piece and one large piece together to make a block. Press seams toward the smaller piece. Make 56 blocks.



Hand or Machine Applique with Turned Edges:

Note: you will not use the larger template.

Cut 56 using the smaller template from Fabric B.

Cut 56 - 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares from the Background fabric.

Place Fabric B on one corner of the background square, lining up the raw edges as shown above. Turn curved seam allowances under and sew by hand or machine along the folded curved edge. Cut the background fabric away from behind the applique. Make 56 blocks.



Fusible Applique:

Note: you will not use the larger template.

Cut out the smaller template and trim the seam allowance *from the curved edge only*. Follow your fusible product's directions to make 56 appliques from Fabric B

Cut 56 - 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares from the Background fabric.

Position Fabric B on one corner of the Background square, lining up the raw edges as shown above and fuse. Zig-zag along the curved edge with invisible monofilament or thread that matches the applique. Make 56 blocks.
