HISTORY OF THE NPQG QUILT SHOW

The first Quilt Show was held in 1983 organized and produced by the women who founded the Guild. It was held at the Northland Library. Only members of the guild participated, each showing several quilts. There was no theme, just "Quilt Show". There was, however, a raffle quilt. Tickets were \$1.00. Since the Guild was not yet an official entity, proceeds were donated to the Library.

1987 - A theme was selected, "Expressions in Quilting", the first of many great themes over the years. The Quilt Shows continued with this format of over 100 quilts and only members participating.

1990 - The Show changed the location to Sacred Heart Church in Bellevue. In 1992 the location was changed again to the North Park Lodge. It remained there through 1998. (Admission was \$2.00, children and seniors - \$1.00.)

2000 - The Show changed dramatically. It was now an "Open Show", allowing non-members to participate. There were now several categories, professional judging, ribbons, and monetary prizes. It was held at Christ Church of Grove Farm through 2002.

2004 – The Show was relocated to the Ross Township Community Center, where It has been held ever since. No Show in 2020, of course, when Covid so disrupted all our lives. Over the years there have been a fairly consistent number of quilts entered each show (100+).

2024 – And here we are again, another Quilt Show is upon us. Stacy Koehler and Mollie Healy and the Committee have been working diligently to get everything ready for another successful Quilt Show. Let's all help to make it a huge success.
