

WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!!

As was announced at the last meeting, we will be handing out block kits for the Quilt Show Raffle Quilt! The block is from Bonnie Hunter's Quiltville called Pineapple Blossom. I have attached a pdf of the block directions. There is a very detailed explanation of how to make your block. There are too many pages to print and include with each of the blocks, so this is more economical. Each of the kits include 5 3.5 inch light squares for the pathways and 8 strips of 2" country color fabrics for the block backgrounds. We have cut the strips so that you may decide where to place the different colors. Your block should measure 9 1/2 inches when finished. You may leave the squaring up to me. I don't mind. A numbered sign-up sheet will be located with the blocks at the dinner for you to sign your name with the number of the block. Blocks are due back to me the first of August so I may have time to assemble a quilt top for the September meeting. Please do not change any of your fabrics in your kits. You may return the completed blocks to me (Carol Hartman, 2072 Reis Run Road, Pgh., PA 15237) by mail or drop off in my white cabinet on the front porch. Carole Holiday at Viking in the Joann Fabrics on MckKnight Road, or Johanna at Piecing it Together will accept blocks also. I will be at the picnic in July, too, for drop off. We have a total of 110 blocks to do; so with your help, one block can turn into many and a beautiful quilt to raffle!

She uses a picture piecing technique, as well as traditional techniques. Cynthia encouraged us to look at the back side of the fabric, as well as the front, and stated that she usually buys half yard pieces. Her entertaining and informative presentation was thoroughly enjoyed by all. A trunk show featuring examples of her beautiful work followed.

Quilt Show: Carol Beck announced that the quilt show will be held at the Ross Township location, April 13 – 17, 2016. The rental has increased. She has a sign up sheet for the Challenge guild and needs help with publicity and the dream baskets. Carol Hartman talked about the Pineapple Block raffle quilt. A minimum of 80 blocks are needed and kits will be available at the dinner. Completed blocks should be returned by August. Workers are needed for the day of the show. Carol encouraged everyone to begin their quilts for the show. Jan will be collecting donations for the Dream Baskets. Items may be brought to the meeting beginning in the fall. If anyone wishes to put a basket together, they are welcome to do so,
