President's Block

There's still time to make a President's block for Stacy. If you have your block done - please bring it to the May Meeting. As luck would have it - neither Stacy nor I can be at the banquet SO that means I will try for the picnic. If that doesn't work - then it will be the September meeting before we can present the blocks to Stacy. But don't use this as an excuse not to get yours done.

Directions for the block are as follows:

The central fussy-cut section should be cut 4 1/2 inches (will finish to 4 inches). It can be anything, any color. If you don't have something fussy-cut-able, a print of some kind is fine.

The frame should be white strips of any kind (solid or white-on-white or mostly white) cut 1 1/2 inches wide.

The finished block should be 6 1/2 inches square.
