## **October Program**

**Hi Everyone ! Time to gear up for another Guild meeting via ZOOM. It's not the same as meeting in person, but it's still great to see other folks and get a quick in. Please give it a try, or try it again if the first time didn't work out.**

**Once you get the hang of it, it really is easy.**

**Instructions for using Zoom are included further down and will be repeated in the invitation you will receive from me ([stacy.koehler@gmail.com](mailto:stacy.koehler@gmail.com)) on SUNDAY. Keep an eye out for it.**

**On Tuesday, October 6, at 7 p.m., we will have our usual business meeting, followed by a short program.**

**The Program is: Houses for Witches and Birdies and Snowmen, Oh My!**

These are quick little seasonal or holiday projects. (each section is about 5x7 inches and they fold flat. They are partially sewn and partially collaged/embellished.

They are quick, (each section requires 3 short, straight seams) and a lot of fun. They are light-weight, store flat in a small space and can be sent in a medium sized envelope. And they are really cute! I will be showing you how to make them and providing instructions.



Alas, virtual meetings mean no Fat Quarter, but let's add **Show and Tell**. **Tracey** putting pictures on our website of all the quilts you've been working on, which are beautiful to see. ### **Instructions for joining Zoom meetings:**

You will be receiving an invitation from Stacy on Sunday Oct 4 for our meeting on Tuesday Oct 6.

To get into a Zoom meeting, you can use a computer (desktop or laptop), a tablet or a smart phone. It's helpful if the device has a camera (most do these days) but even if it doesn't, you can still join, we just won't be able to see you but you will still see and hear us and we will still hear you.

You do not need to download anything to your computer or device. All you have to do is go to the meeting.

When you first join (see below) you will get a message about testing your audio...go ahead and do that. Although probably your device is already set up right.

How to go to a meeting: There's a lot of info on the invitation, most of which you will not need. (A Zoom invitation automatically generates instructions for every possible means of joining a meeting. Don't let it intimidate you!)

You can do it 2 ways. The easiest is to click the link, highlighted in orange, on the invitation. It will take you to a virtual waiting room, which I will take you out of and bring you into the meeting.

If you can't get in that way, go to [www.zoom.com](http://www.zoom.com). In the upper right corner is "Join a Meeting." Click that and when asked put in the Meeting ID and Passcode highlighted in blue on your invitation.

**IMPORTANT: I have set the meeting for 6:30, although it won't actually begin until our usual time at 7:00. I will be there, starting at around 6:15,** to try to get as many as possible hooked up and ready to go. (Bring handwork / book / snack / beverage of choice if you get in early.) I apologize in advance if this gets bogged down in any way.

Patience may be required!

If Rosie could rivet, we can do this!
